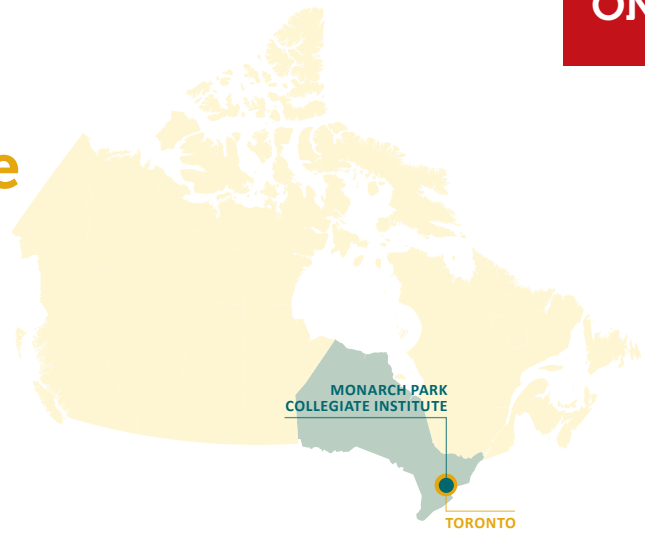

SCHOOL PROFILE

Built in 1965, Monarch Park Collegiate Institute offers the International Baccalaureate Diploma and focuses on social justice, international development, environmentalism, and multicultural studies. It offers the IB Prep program to students in grades 9 and 10 and the IB Diploma program to students in grades 11 and 12.

FACILITIES

In addition to state-of-the-art classrooms, the school has a number of different facilities for students to use, including a beautiful atrium, library, and auditorium. Adjacent to the school is the Monarch Park Stadium, which features an artificial turf field, an all-weather track, and a dome which can be put over the field in winter months.

SPORTS AND ARTS

With a turf field and track right outside the school, Monarch Park is a great place for student-athletes to compete. The school has an indoor swimming pool and hockey rink next door.

Monarch Park provides a number of artistic opportunities — both in terms of fine arts and performing arts — for students. Some of the more unique art offerings include animation, dramatic arts, and live production.

AWARDS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Not only is Monarch Park a well-respected school in terms of academics, but its athletic program is also exceptionally strong. Swimmer Penny Oleksiak won four Olympic medals at the 2016 Summer Olympic Games in Rio De Janeiro, Brazil, taking gold in the women’s 100 meter freestyle, silver in the women’s 100 meter butterfly, and bronze in both the women’s 4x100 meter and 4x200 meter relays. She also won the 2016 Lou Marsh Trophy, given to Canada’s “Athlete of the Year,” and was flag-bearer for the Olympic Games’ Closing Ceremonies.
