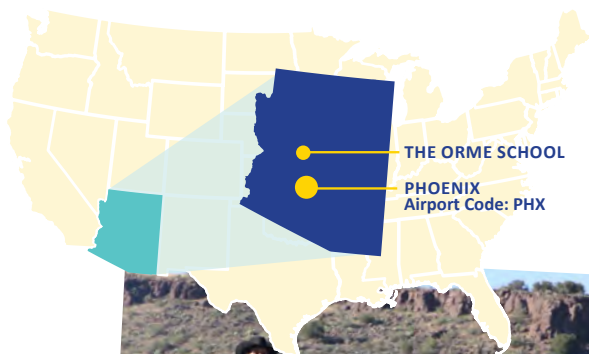

SCHOOL PROFILE

The Orme School is a coeducational, private boarding school with an excellent college preparatory curriculum. The intimate size of the student body creates a family atmosphere and the student-centered academics, combined with a healthy outdoor lifestyle, helps strike a balance between growth and scholastic development.

FACILITIES

Located on a rustic 300-acre campus surrounded by a 26,000-acre working cattle ranch, school facilities feature a planetarium, a greenhouse, multimedia rooms, an outdoor classroom, a photography darkroom, computer center/science labs, art studios, a music room and 17 dormitories. There's also a gymnasium, soccer and football fields, baseball/softball diamond, two equestrian arenas, tennis courts, a pool and a 100-mile cross-country bike lane. Distinguishing Orme's campus from other schools are the restaurant and the health center with a 24-hour doctor on site.

Athletic programs include baseball, basketball, football, tennis, track and volleyball. Orme School also has an outstanding horsemanship program (Western, English, Hunter Jumper, Rodeo).

Students may take part in a variety of programs like outdoor leadership, cheer/dance, drama, choir, band, yearbook and the Annual Fine Arts Festival.
